# A Bill to Modify Title VII to Provide Protection of Gender Identity

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 is hereby amended the definition of "sex  
3 discrimination" to include gender identity discrimination.

4 **SECTION 2.** Gender identity shall mean a person's actual sex, and a person's identity,  
5 appearance, or behavior, whether or not that identity, appearance, or behavior  
6 is different from that traditionally associated with such person's sex at birth.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Labor shall oversee implementation of this legislation.

8 A. The EEOC shall develop an independent review committee to oversee all  
9 gender identity discrimination claims.

10 **SECTION 4.** This will become effective January 1, 2017.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# **A Bill to Repeal the Justice Against Sponsors of Terrorism Act**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

**SECTION 1.** Senate Bill 2040, the Justice Against Sponsors of Terrorism Act (JASTA) is hereby repealed in full.

**SECTION 2.** Any suits filed or otherwise brought against foreign governments pursuant to JASTA since the passage of JASTA will be immediately dismissed.

**SECTION 2.** The State Department, upon passage of this legislation, will direct our embassies and diplomatic missions abroad to inform foreign governments of this development.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation will come into effect immediately upon passage.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

# A Bill to Reform FCC Guidelines to Require Decryption Tools to be Provided to the FBI

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All phone manufactures doing business in the United States must provide  
3 decryption tools to the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) in any and  
4 all federal investigation into terrorism.

5 **SECTION 2.** Federal investigations into terrorism will include any open terrorism case  
6 being investigated by the FBI.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) shall be in charge of the  
8 implementation of this legislation.

9 A. The FCC will duly cooperate with the Federal Bureau of Investigation  
10 to determine terrorism investigations that require decryption tools.

11 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2017.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
