Location, Date & Time

Time: 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m., dinner following (details below)

Location: WeWork Financial District (85 Broad Street New York, NY 10004)

WeWork is a co-sharing office work space (see: <https://www.wework.com/locations/new-york-city/fidi>). Please build in some cushion for your arrival, check-in at the lobby and building pass. We would like all participants to arrive in the actual conference room no later than 9:00 a.m. There will be a light breakfast followed by some brief announcements.

All rounds will be single flighted. We expect to start Round 1 by 9:30 a.m. Lunch will be served after Round 3. We expect the competitive portion of the round robin to conclude by 6:00pm with a banquet (see details below), with awards during the banquet.

Transportation

WeWork Financial District is easily accessible by public transportation:

- 2,3 train to Wall Street
- 4,5 train to Bowling Green
- R to Whitehall Street

Exiting at any of those subway stops is only a five minute walk away from our WeWork location.
