We will conduct two sessions. Dinner will be served and awards will be given to all participants. We expect to start the first session at 3pm.

Transportation & Parking

Bronx Science is easily accessible by public transportation. Take the #4 or D/B train to the Bedford Park Blvd stop. Walk west on Bedford Park Boulevard and turn right on Paul Avenue. The school is about a 10 minute walk from the train station.

There is ample street parking near the school. The faculty parking lot will not be available for use until after 3pm on Friday.

Registration & Payment

Costs for participating in the Big Apple Round Robin are as follows:

- \$50 per Congressional Debate Entry
- We ask each entry to provide one judge

The Big Apple Round Robin has electronic registration on tabroom. You have been pre-entered. We just need your judge information. As with the New York City Invitational, we will be using e-ballots throughout the Big Apple Round Robin. Once you register, your invoice will be automatically generated.
