A Bill to Declare "Black Lives Matter" a Domestic Terrorist Organization

1. Be it enacted by the congress here assembled that:
2. **Section 1:** The "Black Lives Matter" movement be regarded and combatted as a
3. Domestic terrorist organization by the United States government.
4. **Section 2:** A domestic terrorist organization is defined as
5. "An organization that performs acts dangerous to human life that violate federal or state
6. Law with the intention of influencing a civilian population or the conduct or policies of
7. The government that occur primarily in US jurisdiction."
8. **Section 3:** The National Counterterrorism Center will oversee the enforcement of this bill
9. To begin the effective protection of The American people from this organization.
10. **Section 4:** This bill will be implemented by January 1st, 2016.
11. **Section 5:** All laws that are in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO RESTORE TRUST IN THE VA HEALTH CARE SYSTEM TO ADEQUATELY TREAT OUR VETERANS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- SECTION 1.** The United States shall take five actions the improve the VA health care system.
 - A. All veterans on wait lists are screened and triaged for care.
 - B. The VA should refocus its performance-management system to fit the VA’s Strategic Analytics for Improvement and Learning (SAIL).
 - C. The U.S Department of Veterans’ affairs secretary will create a non-partisan committee to design a new access strategy that draws on modern information and advanced communications technologies to facilitate caregiver–patient connectivity and that uses personalized care plans to address patients' individual access needs and preferences.
 - D. The VA shall participate fully in performance-reporting initiatives, expanding learning-and-improvement partnerships with outside entities and making performance data broadly available.
 - E. The United States shall increase the funds it provides to the Department of Veterans Affairs by \$90 million US dollars per year to be spent on the salaries of newly hired of doctors to fill vacancies.
- SECTION 2.** Performance-reporting initiatives shall be defined as the program run by the Leapfrog Group, and the program run by Hospital Compare. A newly hired doctor is a doctor that is hired specifically to fill a current vacancy.
- SECTION 3.** The Department of Veterans Affairs shall be responsible for enforcing
- SECTION 4.** Section 1A, 1B, and 1C shall go into effect immediately after passage. Section 1D will go into effect one year after passage. Section 1E shall go into effect at the start of the next fiscal year.
- SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Eliminate the "Anchor Babies"

1. Whereas: Children of illegal immigrants are becoming U.S. citizens since they were
2. born on U.S. soil, a right provided them by the 14th Amendment; and
3. Whereas: These children create an "anchor" for their illegal parents and other family
4. members to reside in the U.S.
5. Whereas: a minor is therefore dictating who is legally permitted to live in the United
6. States when in every other legal aspect of our country, the parents must
7. represent the minor child.
8. Whereas: this loophole is causing hardships on our country financially and
9. educationally as many of the parents do not speak English.
10. Therefore, be it resolved by this Student Congress here assembled that: birth right
11. citizenship can only be granted when at least one parent of the minor is an
12. American citizen. If neither is an American citizen, the family must either
13. go through the naturalization process or face deportation. Only at the age
14. of 18 (legal adulthood age), can the American born minor provide birth
15. right citizenship for his/her family.

A Resolution to Ban the Use Tanning Facilities to Teens

1. Whereas: melanoma is one of the most common forms of cancer diagnosed in
2. 15-29 year olds; and
3. Whereas: indoor tanners have a 69% chance of increased risk every 6 sessions;
4. and
5. Whereas: Students in high school and college have a greater risk of developing
6. melanoma by 10%, the risk is increased to 73% every six tans; and
7. Whereas: indoor ultraviolet tanners are 74% more likely to develop melanoma
8. than those who have never tanned indoors; and
9. Whereas: Those who begin tanning before the age of 35 increase their
10. melanoma risk by 87%; and
11. Whereas: of the 30 million people who tan indoors in the U.S. every year, 2-3
12. million of them are teens.
13. Therefore be it resolved by this Student Congress that tanning facilities are
14. not permitted to serve anyone under the age of 18, regardless of
15. parental permission.
