A BILL TO AID ISRAEL TO BOLSTER SECURITY

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States will provide military aid to Israel to strengthen their
3 defensive infrastructure from hostile powers.

4 SECTION 2. "Defensive infrastructure" shall be defined as any sanctions of the Israeli
5 armed forces that oversee domestic security.

6 SECTION 3. A. The Department of State and Department of the Treasury will oversee
7 the enforcement of this bill.

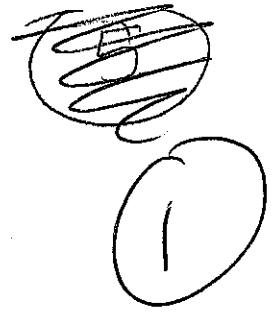
8 B. \$100 million dollars will be allocated directly to the Israeli Ministry of

A Bill to Lift more of the U.S. Embargos on Cuba to Encourage Trade and Travel between the United States and the Republic of Cuba.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. **SECTION 1.** Lifting more embargos that the United States has on Cuba to increase national
2. relationship with the Cuban nation.
3. **SECTION 2.** To lift more embargos to increase trade and improve the relationship the United
4. States and Cuba have had since the cold war.
5. **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of State will oversee the enforcement of the bill
6. and the ensurement of trade and regulation with Cuba.
7. i. The United States Department of State shall regulate its diplomacy with Cuba.
8. ii. The United States Department of State will overlook all imports as well as
9. those that are export to Cuba through legal means.
10. **SECTION 4.** Be it resolved, by the congress here today that this bill shall be implemented to
11. allow trade, and therefore increase relations with the neighboring country of
12. Cuba.
13. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Mandatory, Medically Accurate Sex Education to Include Equality for all Genders

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All States shall create and implement on the high school level a curriculum to include medically accurate sex education to include sexting, affirmative consent, and equality for all genders.

SECTION 2. Medically accurate is defined to include alternatives and additions to an abstinence policy and the consequences to such alternatives and additions; sexting is defined as the transmission through texts sexually explicit messages and/or images; affirmative consent is defined as knowing, voluntary and mutual decision among all participants to engage in sexual activity; and all genders is defined as male, female, and transgendered individuals.

SECTION 3. The Department of Education and the Department of Health shall work in conjunction and oversee this bill..

A. The Department of Education will develop the standard, mandatory curriculum as defined by this bill.

B. The Department of Health will fund and oversee the effectiveness of the newly adopted federal curriculum.

SECTION 4. This bill shall go into effect August 2017 in all school districts in the United States.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Lead-Free America Act of 2017

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. A. 335 billion dollars shall be allocated to state governments to replace pipe infrastructure in the United States based on assessed need.

B. 327 billion dollars shall be allocated to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) annually to decrease prevalence of lead paint in homes, with a focus on reducing these cases in urban areas.

1. Those with an income of under 100,000 a year are entitled to complimentary lead-paint removal services.

2. Inspection and removal of lead paint from public housing is required.

SECTION 2. A. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) shall assess individual states' need for pipe infrastructure replacement.

B. After this legislation has been completely implemented, The Center for Disease Control (CDC) shall evaluate lead levels in water every 3 months. If there is evidence of lead contamination, a restoration process shall take place immediately.

SECTION 3. Funding for this legislation will be acquired as follows:

A. Former manufacturers, distributors, advocates for decreased regulation or a dismantling of the lead industry, and those guilty of concealing the imminent and chronic harms of lead poisoning are subject to pay damages to victims and their families under this legislation.

1. This stipulation includes litigation of government officials and administrations with offenses of negligence or inaction in regards to lead contamination incidents.

B. A .6% Financial Transaction Tax will be implemented to fund this piece of legislation

SECTION 4. This bill, including budgetary stipulations, shall be phased in over the course of 15 years, beginning in Fiscal Year 2018 and taking full effect in 2031.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Reform the United States Immigration System

Be it enacted by this Congress that:

Section 1: The United States of America will institute a points-based system for selecting immigrants that are allowed access to our country.

Section 2: The points-based system would be modeled on the Australian immigration System. Immigrants would be accepted for immigration based on points awarded for competency in English, qualifications, past work experience, etc.

Section 3: This legislation will come into effect at the beginning of the 2018 fiscal year.

Section 4: The U.S. Department of Labor will oversee this bill and will provide H-2A visas to migrant workers who meet their requirements.

Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

A Bill to Implement a Fair Tax System in the United States

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** A Fair Tax is a single national consumption tax on retail sales with
- 3. a monthly prebate to cover taxes on basic necessities.
- 4. **SECTION 2.** A prebate is defined as a refund of taxes you are going to pay on
- 5. purchases of necessities.
- 6. **SECTION 3.** The National Fair Tax would be set to 23% inclusive on all
- 7. consumption (30% at the register).
- 8. **SECTION 4.** The IRS will be defunded within 10 years of passing this
- 9. resolution, and states will oversee the collection of the taxes with a
- 10. percentage given to fund the state governments.
- 11. **SECTION 5.** A monthly prebate would be sent to each household of \$220 per
- 12. adult and \$77 per child per month to pay for taxes on basic
- 13. necessities.
- 14. **SECTION 6.** A Fair Tax system will be implemented over the course of 10 years
- 15. starting on January 1, 2017 with each year increasing the Fair Tax
- 16. proportionately to the amount of reductions on other forms of tax
- 17. in equal segments.
- 18. **SECTION 7.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- 19. and void.
