Special Information:

This event is made possible by a pair of grants from the NSDA. The amount of grant money is determined based on participation (receiving the maximum award at 45 participants per site), and will be distributed in the following way:

20% will go into a fund to help support new member teams forming within the state.

80% will be split among the participating schools in the following way:

Schools will earn 1 share per student competing, up to a maximum of 5 shares. The total number of shares will be tallied, and a dollar amount will then be put on each share.

Participating schools will then receive a check based on their total shares. Please note that the process will take time, since the MFA first needs to receive the funds from the NSDA.
