A Resolution to Provide Guidance for the Elimination of Regulations

- 1. WHEREAS, President Trump has signed an executive order which will force the
- 2. elimination of two governmental regulations for every new regulation adopted by the
- 3. executive branch; and
- 4. WHEREAS, many regulations are adopted for the health and safety of Americans; and
- 5. WHEREAS, other regulations protect the American people from fraud and crime; and
- 6. WHEREAS, the executive order will result in either necessary regulations not being
- 7. adopted or necessary regulations being needlessly rescinded in order to meet this
- 8. artificial quota; and
- 9. **WHEREAS**, the burden of regulations on small businesses does not justify the wholesale
- 10. elimination of such regulations; and
- 11. WHEREAS, the politicization of the Executive Branch makes it likely that regulations will
- 12. be eliminated without the strong consideration of the consequences of such
- 13. deregulation; now, therefore, be it
- 14. RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled that it is the desire of this Congress that all
- 15. regulations which will be eliminated by the President's executive orders should be
- 16. submitted for Congressional review and approval.

A Bill to Protect Military Interpreters

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. All foreign nationals who served as an interpreter for the United States
- 3. military during the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan shall receive lawful permanent
- 4. resident status within the United States.
- 5. **Section 2**. Such status may also be extended to the immediate family of the
- 6. interpreter. This status shall not be infringed by any executive order currently issued, or
- 7. which may be issued in the future.
- 8. **Section 3.** The Department of Defense will identify those who have served in such
- 9. roles in the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan. The Secretary of Defense shall coordinate
- 10. with the Secretary of State and the Secretary of Homeland Security to insure that the
- 11. appropriate documentation is issued. Funding to provide transportation to the United
- 12. States for the interpreters and their immediate families shall come from the current
- 13. military personnel budget.
- 14. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect upon passage.
- 15. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Sanction Venezuela for Food Trafficking

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. Economic sanctions shall be imposed against officials in the Venezuelan
- 3. military and government who are identified as engaging in illegal trafficking in food.
- 4. **Section 2**. Economic sanctions may include freezing bank accounts, prohibiting the
- 5. distribution of goods and services, or tariffs on imports intended for sanctioned officials.
- 6. **Section 3.** The Department of State shall identify which Venezuelan military and
- 7. governmental officials are engaged in the trafficking of food. Upon identification, the
- 8. Department of the Treasury will impose sanctions until such time as the Secretary of
- 9. State has determined that the Venezuelan president has confirmed that those engaged
- 10. in such trafficking have been arrested, convicted, and imprisoned.
- 11. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on May 1, 2017.
- 12. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Keep Your Data Uber-Safe

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. All personally identifiable metadata gathered in the course of providing a
- 3. location-based service through a mobile application shall be saved for a period of no
- 4. longer than twenty-four hours. In no case shall metadata of any kind which is acquired
- 5. by a company providing location-based services be stored for more than thirty days.
- 6. This shall not apply to any information required to be saved due to current regulation or
- 7. pending legal action.
- 8. **Section 2**. Metadata may include personally identifying information or data relating
- 9. to your location at the time before, during, or after services are provided.
- 10. **Section 3.** The Federal Trade Commission will oversee enforcement of this
- 11. legislation. Violations shall result in a fine of no less than \$10,000 per affected
- 12. consumer.
- 13. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on June 1, 2017.
- 14. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Endless Candidacy

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. No person shall officially declare and file for as a candidate for federal
- 3. elected office prior to 365 days before the election in which their office shall be
- 4. contested.
- 5. **Section 2**. Any candidate so currently declared for the elections to be held in 2020
- 6. will have their candidacy suspended until November of 2019.
- 7. **Section 3.** The Federal Election Commission shall create procedures for ensuring
- 8. that no person shall be considered a candidate, and treated as such, prior to one year
- 9. before the election for their desired office.
- 10. A. The FEC shall use the remaining balance of the Presidential Election Campaign Fund
- 11. to implement this process.
- 12. **B.** Violations of section 1, or the creation of any organization which shall act to
- 13. contravene section 1, shall result in such candidacy being invalid, and the individual
- 14. being considered ineligible for federal office.
- 15. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect immediately, but will apply to offices which shall be
- 16. contested in 2020.
- 17. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Mediate in Indio/Pakistan Affairs

- 1. WHEREAS, India and Pakistan are closer to war than any point in the last 50 years; and
- 2. **WHEREAS**, the next war between the two countries may result in the deployment of
- 3. nuclear weapons; and
- 4. WHEREAS, President Trump has spoken to Pakistani Prime minister Sharif to offer his
- 5. support; and
- 6. WHEREAS, the attacks on the Indian military base at Uri were intended to get the
- 7. attention of the international community; and
- 8. WHEREAS, India's response to the attacks was out of proportion; and
- 9. WHEREAS, the Obama administration resisted taking sides in the conflict; now,
- 10. therefore, be it
- 11. **RESOLVED,** By the Congress here assembled that the United States Executive Branch
- 12. insert itself into the conflict between India and Pakistan by pressuring India to reach an
- 13. agreement with Pakistan on the disputed territory of Kashmir.

A Bill to Rescind the Global Gag Rule

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. International health funding shall be provided to qualified organizations
- 3. with no limitations as to the discussion of contraception or abortion.
- 4. **Section 2**. This shall not be considered a repeal of any rule prohibiting United States
- 5. funds from being used to directly provide abortions or abortion services.
- 6. **Section 3.** The United States Agency for International Development will oversee
- 7. distribution of funding and insure compliance with the terms and requirements of said
- 8. funds.
- 9. **SECTION 4.** This will take effect immediately upon passage.
- 10. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Protect Your Right to Repair

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. All manufacturers of personal electronic devices sold in the United States
- 3. shall make publically available:
- 4. A. Detailed information about how to repair common damage to the device.
- 5. **B.** Detailed information on components of the device which may need to be replaced.
- 6. **Section 2**. Personal electronic devices may include cellular phones, tablets, personal
- 7. computers, and other like devices. Information related to repair and components must
- 8. be made available upon request to anyone with a personal or commercial purpose for
- 9. requesting such information.
- 10. **Section 3.** The Federal Communications Commission will oversee implementation
- 11. and enforcement of this legislation. Failure to comply with the terms of sections one
- 12. and two will result in the Federal Communications Commission and the Consumer
- 13. Product Safety Commission issuing a recall for all devices for which information is
- 14. withheld.
- 15. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on January 1, 2018.
- 16. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Distribute Baby Boxes

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. Grants in the total amount of \$1 billion shall be distributed to the
- 3. individual states for the purpose of developing programs which provide necessary
- 4. supplies for newborn babies and mothers.
- 5. **Section 2**. The supplies must include a box designed to allow the newborn baby to
- 6. sleep in a manner which will prevent sudden infant death syndrome. Other supplies
- 7. may include clothing, diapers, formula, and bottles.
- 8. **Section 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee the
- 9. distribution of the grants. Funding shall be provided by redistributing funding from the
- 10. 2010 Affordable Care Act tax on medical devices.
- 11. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on April 1, 2017.
- 12. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Formalize the Privacy Shield

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **Section 1**. The agreement between the United States and the European Union to
- 3. provide equivalent privacy for personal data, shall be made permanent.
- 4. **Section 2**. The agreement, also known as the Privacy Shield, shall not be subject to
- 5. executive order.
- 6. **Section 3.** The Federal Trade Commission shall oversee enforcement of this
- 7. legislation. The FTC shall continue negotiations with the European Union to ensure that
- 8. all agreements meet the privacy standards of both parties.
- 9. **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect upon passage.
- 10. **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
