On behalf of the ASU Forensics team and the Hugh Downs School of Communication, we would like to welcome you to our beautiful campus. This year's tournament has some of the largest competition at the tournament in recent memory, with 116 schools and 17 states represented.

Parking information: You can pay to park in Lot 20 Visitor Parking located on the northwest corner of campus on University & Mill. This lot will remain open until 10pm. On Sunday, you can park for free in the Gammage Hall Lot (Lot 3) at the intersection of Mill, Apache, and Forest Ave. The Apache and Rural Road structures are also open for paid visitor parking on Thursday/Friday but they close at 9pm. 10th Street, Apache, and Rural Road structures should be open to park for free on Saturday and Sunday.

Bus drop off information: Closest to tournament HQ: Forest Avenue L, southwest corner of campus, next to Gammage Hall. Next closest: The Myrtle/10th Street L on the Northwest side of campus. Least convenient: north section of McAlister Avenue, runs through eastern half of campus. NOTE: if your bus needs to park near campus during the day, contact us directly at hdshcforensics@gmail.com and we can provide information.

- **Online Registration – If you are fully paid or have provided a complete Purchase Order** to the tournament, **you do not need to physically attend registration**. Go to asu.tabroom.com, click the Onsite Registration tab, and confirm that all of your events and judges are accurate.
- **Registration** – Thursday, 5-7pm, SS 105 (you may register your entire team at this time). Schools that are **fully paid** may use the Online Registration system and bypass registration entirely. Schools that have submitted a **Purchase Order**, who do not have a check, and have **NO** changes may email hdshcforensics@gmail.com to confirm that they have no changes and bypass in-person registration as well.

- **ALL judges must check in at SS 105 each morning, or when they arrive**

- **Congress/Speech awards** will be held in Murdock 201 at the completion Speech Finals.

Special Tabroom.com features. We strongly encourage all judges and students to create accounts at Tabroom.com to get the most out of the online features it has to offer. **This is required for ALL LD, PF, CX, and Speech judges.** Anyone with an account can receive texts and/or emails of the pairings or look them up at asu.tabroom.com. Students can claim their entry at the tournament and receive online notifications of their pending rounds. Judges will receive their ballots online. Coaches can choose to receive notifications for any of their students.
