A BILL TO REMEDY THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **S**ECTION **1.** A one-cent-per-milligram excise tax shall be placed on all active opioids at the time of purchase by the consumer.
- **SECTION 2. A.** The term "active opioid" means any controlled substance which is opium, an opiate, or any derivative thereof (e.g. oxycodone, hydrocodone).
 - **B.** The use of prescription opioids as an official treatment method for addiction, if confirmed by a doctor and rehabilitation counselor, shall be excluded from this excise tax.
 - **C.** Funds from the tax shall be earmarked for funding towards opioid relief efforts, such as naloxone, education, and rehabilitation.
- **SECTION 3.** The Internal Revenue Service will work in conjunction with the Department of Health and Human Services.
- **S**ECTION **4.** The provisions of this bill shall take effect on October 1st of 2017.
- **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
