Location, Date & Time

WeWork is a co-sharing office work space (see: https://www.wework.com/locations/new-york-city/fidi). Please build in some cushion for your arrival, check-in at the lobby and building pass. We would like all participants to arrive in the actual conference room no later than 9:30 a.m. There will be a light breakfast followed by some brief announcements.

All rounds will be single flighted. We expect to start Round 1 by 10:00 a.m. Lunch will be served after Round 3. We expect the competitive portion of the round robin to conclude by 6:00 p.m. with a banquet (see details below).

Transportation

WeWork Financial District is easily accessible by public transportation:
