3		(Authorization for Use of Military Force) and 50 U.S.C. Chapter 33 (War Powers Resolution of

5	SECTION 2	A. The Conflict Accountability Committee shall consist of the Speaker of the House of
6		Representatives, the Majority and Minority Leaders of the Senate and the House of

8		Armed Services, Appropriations, and Intelligence of both the Senate and House of Representatives.
9		B. Before deploying troops to a specified warzone, the President must submit a classified report to

12		that area.
13		C. No later than 30 days following the deployment of troops to the specified warzone, the
14		committee shall introduce a Resolution of Consent, which must be considered, debated, and voted
15		upon within 30 days of the introduction of the resolution. After introduction of the Resolution of
16		Consent, the classified report outlined in Section 1A shall be declassified to the remainder of
17		Congress. If the Resolution of Consent fails, the President must withdraw troops from the specified
18		warzone within 15 days.
19		D. The committee may introduce a Resolution of Objection if the committee believes troops need
20		to be withdrawn at any point. If such a resolution is passed, all troops must be withdrawn from the
21		location specified in the Resolution of Objection within 15 days. If a Resolution of Objection is
22		passed, the President may not deploy troops to the location specified in the resolution for another
23		90 days.
24		E. The committee may introduce a Resolution of Consolation if they believe troops need to be
25		deployed before the end of the 90-day wait time of the Resolution of Objection. If Congress passes
26		such a resolution, the President may deploy troops to the location specified in the Resolution of
27		Consolation immediately and at will.
28	SECTION 3.	The Department of Defense shall oversee implementation of this legislation.

B/R #1403 (Finals) A Bill to Sanction Uzbekistan Cotton to Prevent Forced Labor

3		preventing all US manufacturers from buying Uzbek cotton and retailers

6		of Uzbekistan.
7		B. Sanctions refer to a total embargo on the purchase of or sale of Uzbek

10		A. Entities purchasing Uzbek cotton or products containing Uzbek cotton
11		will be fined no more than \$1,000,000 per offending purchase and be
