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A Bill to Protect Wildlife

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: | |
|----|--|---|
| 2 | SECTION 1. | No citizen or permanent lawful resident of the United States shall be |
| 3 | | issued, or shall be permitted to obtain, any permit, tag, or license which |
| 4 | | shall allow them to hunt any animal currently listed on the protected or |
| 5 | | endangered species lists either domestically or internationally. |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | A. Such permits or tags, often issued in the interest of conservation |
| 7 | | efforts, shall not be offered for sale, offered as a prize at auction or raffle, |
| 8 | | or gifted to any citizen or permanent lawful resident. |
| 9 | | B . The importation of part of any animal which is identified as protected |
| 10 | | or endangered shall be forbidden. |
| 11 | SECTION 3. | The U.S Fish and Wildlife Service shall oversee implementation of this |
| 12 | | legislation. Any violation of Section 1 shall be considered a Class C felony |
| 13 | | punishable with a prison sentence of between 10 and 25 years. |
| 14 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect upon passage. |
| 15 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. |



A Bill to Reprioritize the COPS Program

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: | | |

| 2 | SECTION 1. | No new funding shall be appropriated to the Department of Justice until | |
| 3 | | reporting through the Community Oriented Policing Services program | |
| 4 | | (COPS) is up to date, and recommendations have been made to local | |
| 5 | | police departments that have requested assistance. | |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | The COPS program promotes cooperation between local law | |
| 7 | | enforcement and the communities they serve. In cases where a | |
| 8 | | department is in crisis, such as after an officer-involved shooting, COPS | |
| 9 | | may provide reports and recommendations on how to reestablish trust in | |
| 10 | | law enforcement. | |
| 11 | SECTION 3. | The Attorney General will provide testimony to Congress no later than | |
| 12 | | sixty days after passage explaining what progress the Department of | |
| 13 | | Justice has made in responding to communities which have asked COPS | |
| 14 | | for assistance, and to provide reasoning for any delays in the | |
| 15 | | Department's response. | |
| 16 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect upon passage. | |
| 17 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. | |



The Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2017

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: | | |

| 2 | SECTION 1. | All Interstate highway improvement needs, as determined by the Federal | |
| 3 | | Highway Administration and the Interstate Maintenance program, shall | |
| 4 | | be put out to bid for private contractors who will complete the work at | |
| 5 | | their own expense. | |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | Such private contractors may be permitted to charge a toll for travel | |
| 7 | | upon the segment of highway which they maintain. They will retain toll | |
| 8 | | rights for a period of ten years. The private contractor shall be permitted | |
| 9 | | to set the price of the toll at a level by which they estimate they will | |
| 10 | | recover their costs within seven years. | |
| 11 | SECTION 3. | The Department of Transportation shall oversee the procurement of | |
| 12 | | private contractors to maintain the interstate highway system. The | |
| 13 | | portion of the federal tax on gasoline intended for highway maintenance | |
| 14 | | shall be removed for a period of 10 years. | |
| 15 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect on October 1, 2018. | |
| 16 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. | |



A Bill to Expand Gigabit Access

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: | | |

| 2 | SECTION 1. | Funds in the amount of \$20 billion shall be made available to companies | |
| 3 | | for the purpose of providing high speech broadband internet to areas | |
| 4 | | designated by the Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission | |
| 5 | | as an "Area of Need." | |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | An "Area of Need" shall be considered any area which meets the | |
| 7 | | following criteria: | |
| 8 | | A. The median income of the area is no more than 130% of the federal | |
| 9 | | poverty level, and | |
| 10 | | B. Less than half of the households in the area currently have access to, | |
| 11 | | or subscribe to, internet service with consistent speeds of 100 Mbps | |
| 12 | | or greater. | |
| 13 | SECTION 3. | The FCC shall oversee implementation and funding of this legislation. The | |
| 14 | | FCC shall also set procedures by which contractors shall apply for funding | |
| 15 | | and standards to determine whether a company has met requirements | |
| 16 | | for providing service to an "Area of Need." Funding shall be provided in | |
| 17 | | the 2019 FCC budget through the standard appropriations process. | |
| 18 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect upon passage. The Chairman shall make the | |
| 19 | | designation of "Areas of Need" no later than October 1, 2018. | |
| 20 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. | |



A Resolution to Permit Japan to Defend Itself

| 1 | WHEREAS, | since World War II, Japan's military capabilities have been limited to |

| 2 | | defensive forces; and |
| 3 | WHEREAS, | the Japanese Self-Defense Forces are currently supplemented and |
| 4 | | supported by United States Military personnel; and |
| 5 | WHEREAS, | there has been growing tension between United States and Japanese |
| 6 | | military forces, particularly with regard to Okinawa; and |
| 7 | WHEREAS, | the threat to Japan posed by North Korea has been increasing; and |
| 8 | WHEREAS, | the recent North Korean missile test violated Japan's air space; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, | Chinese claims in the South China Sea infringe on the territorial rights of |
| 10 | | Japan and the Philippines; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, | the United States is committed to defend Japan against threats; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, | United States military action in defense of Japan will contribute to |
| 13 | | destabilization of the region; now, therefore, be it |
| 14 | RESOLVED, | By the Congress here assembled that the United States shall support |
| 15 | | Japan's efforts to build an offensive military force to protect itself against |
| 16 | | all threats, and be it |
| 17 | FURTHER RES | SOLVED, that this Congress shall support a change to Japan's constitution |
| 18 | | to allow the establishment of a permanent Japanese military . |



A Bill to Ban Land Contracts

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: | | |

| 2 | SECTION 1. | No state shall sanction or permit the purchase or sale of real estate | |
| 3 | | property through land contracts. In addition, currently known land | |
| 4 | | contracts must be voided, and the buyers provided with an opportunity | |
| 5 | | to convert the land contract to a traditional mortgage. | |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | Land contracts are defined as a method of sale by which the seller retains | |
| 7 | | the title of the property while the buyer pays in installments. These | |
| 8 | | contracts often feature a large down payment and a balloon payment at | |
| 9 | | the end. | |
| 10 | SECTION 3. | The Department of Housing and Urban Development shall oversee | |
| 11 | | implementation of these regulations. States which do not meet the | |
| 12 | | requirements of Section one by the effective date shall be considered | |
| 13 | | ineligible for Fair Housing Initiative Program grant funding. | |
| 14 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect on January 1, 2018. | |
| 15 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. | |



A Bill to Clean the Hanford Site

| 1 | BE IT ENACTED | BY THE | CONGRESS HERE | ASSEMBLED THAT: |

2 **SECTION 1**. The nuclear waste contained in pools at the Hanford, Washington nuclear

3 site shall be disposed using Deep Borehole Disposal techniques.

- 4 **SECTION 2**. Deep Borehole Disposal consists of small holes, drilled no less than three
- 5 miles into the Earth's crust, where containers of nuclear waste are

6 inserted for safe long-term storage.

- 7 SECTION 3. The Department of Energy shall oversee the development of the Deep
- 8 Borehole sites and shall take responsibility for identifying locations for
- 9 the project. Funding shall be appropriated by redirecting \$500 million of
- 10 the Environmental Protection Agency's Superfund program for fiscal year
- 11 2019.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on January 1, 2019. All waste material from the
- 13 Hanford site shall be disposed of by no later than January 1, 2023.
- 14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



The Operation Inherent Resolve Enhancement Act of 2017

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
SECTION 1. The Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve shall fully

| 3 | | integrate the Peshmerga military forces of Iraqi Kurdistan into the effort |

| 4 | | to defeat the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL). |
| 5 | SECTION 2. | A. Military training shall be provided to 100,000 Peshmerga troops. |
| 6 | | B. Additionally, 1,000 military vehicles and 500,000 small-arms weapons |
| 7 | | shall be provided to the Peshmerga upon completion of the training. |
| 8 | | C. These troops shall be deployed to the border between Iraq and Syria |
| 9 | | for the purpose of identifying and engaging ISIL forces. |
| 10 | SECTION 3. | US Central Command shall oversee the training and distribute arms to |
| 11 | | the Peshmerga. Funding for these operations shall be appropriated |
| 12 | | through normal means. |
| 13 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect upon passage. |
| 14 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. |



A Bill to Provide Flexibility in Student Loans

| 1 | BE IT ENACTE | ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: |

| 2 | SECTION 1. | Section 455 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 is amended as follows: |
| 3 | | A. All references to a "6 month grace period" prior to repayment shall |
| 4 | | be changed to a "12 month grace period." |
| 5 | | B. No interest shall accrue on the student loan until the end of the 12 |
| 6 | | month grace period prior to repayment. |
| 7 | SECTION 2. | The Secretary of Education, through a loan modification process, shall |
| 8 | | pay to each borrower who received a Federal Direct Stafford Loan for |
| 9 | | which the first disbursement was made during the period between July 1, |
| 10 | | 2012, and July 1, 2014, an amount equal to the amount of interest that |
| 11 | | accrued on such loan prior to the beginning of the repayment period. |
| 12 | SECTION 3. | The Department of Education will oversee the implementation of this |
| 13 | | legislation. Funding for the loan modifications as described in Section |
| 14 | | two shall be taken from a fifty percent reduction in funds intended for |
| 15 | | private school voucher programs. |
| 16 | SECTION 4. | This shall take effect on June 1, 2018. |
| 17 | SECTION 5. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. |



A Resolution to Rein in Early Elections

| 1 | WHEREAS, | the next presidential election will be held in November of 2020; and |

| 2 | WHEREAS, | most presidents refrain from openly campaigning for reelection until the |
| 3 | | year before the election; and |
| 4 | WHEREAS, | President Trump officially launched his reelection campaign on January |
| 5 | | 20, 2017; and |
| 6 | WHEREAS, | a majority of his public appearances since that time have been campaign |
| 7 | | rallies designed to excite his base; and |
| 8 | WHEREAS, | such events have sparked protests and resulted in violence; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, | even if the rallies have been paid for by campaign funds, there is still a |
| 10 | | significant cost to the taxpayers of the city where such events are held; |
| 11 | | and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, | there is also a significant cost for Secret Service protection during said |
| 13 | | events; and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, | such rallies diminish the image of the office of the presidency; now, |
| 15 | | therefore, be it |
| 16 | RESOLVED, | By the Congress here assembled that this Congress strongly condemns |
| 17 | | the president's use of campaign-style rallies so early in his administration. |
