## A Bill to End United States Membership in the United Nations

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1**. The United States shall withdrawal from the United Nations participation.
- **SECTION 2.** Participation in the United Nations includes military participation, financial participation and all obligations thereto in any capacity.
- SECTION 3. The United States State Department will no longer fund the United Nations in any form. All funds will be allocated evenly to the Department of education and the Department of Defense at the beginning of the next fiscal year.
- **SECTION 4.** This will be enacted at the beginning of the next USFG fiscal year (October 1).
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to End Discrimination Based on Sexuality in the Collection of Blood Donations

WHEREAS, Blood banks in the United States routinely operate with a short blood supply

WHEREAS, The American Red Cross (ARC) has joined the American Association for Blood Banks (AABB) and America's Blood Centers (ABC) in asking for a reevaluation of current donor donation deferral policies

WHEREAS, Many homosexual and bisexual men are healthy, do not present a risk of introducing a transfusion transmissible infection such as HIV into the nation's blood supply, and wish to be donors without compromising the safety or reliability of the supply.

WHEREAS, Technological advances such as individual NAT, pathogen inactivation, or added means of screening hold promise to substantially reduce the risk that transfusion transmissible infections from all donors

RESOLVED, Be it enacted by the Congress assembled here that the U.S.Department of Health and Human Services shall no longer prohibit the donation of blood based on donor sexuality
