A Bill to Replace The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Act to Create a Permanent Residence Process

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Law-abiding illegal persons who enter the United States as
2 minors will be granted a path to legal status and both deferred action and
3 an opportunity for a temporary work permit while applying for said status.

4 **SECTION 2. Defining** Law-abiding as committing no more than 3
5 nonviolent misdemeanors, a felony, or a significant misdemeanor.

6 **Defining** Deferred action as a temporary order against the enforcement of
7 immigration laws for persons in this process.

8 **Defining** temporary work permit as a temporary status given to these
9 immigrants to stay in the United States provided that they have legal
10 employment.

11 **Defining** minor as a person under the age of 16.

12 **Providing** that the person must be enrolled in, or have completed high
13 school or a GED.

14 **Defining** legal status as the status of permanent residence, otherwise
15 known as a “green card”.

16 **Granting** the Department of Homeland Security the authority to determine
17 the logistics of the process for legal status.

18 **Requiring** The recipients to have been in the United States, and be below
19 the age of 31 before the 6th of september 2017

20 **SECTION 3.** This will be implemented by the Department of Homeland
21 Security and corresponding subdivisions such as the USCIS

22 **SECTION 4.** This bill comes into effect when the Deferred action for
23 Childhood arrivals act expires.

24 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
25 null and void.

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INTRODUCED FOR CONGRESSIONAL DEBATE BY KIERAN SINGH

A Bill to Repeal the Three Strikes Rule.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. WE WILL NO LONGER USE THE THREE STRIKES RULE FOR FEDERAL CRIMES.

SECTION 2. THE THREE STRIKES RULE IS DEFINED AS ANY STATUTE THAT IMPOSES HARSHER SENTENCES ON HABITUAL OFFENDERS WHO ARE PREVIOUSLY CONVICTED OF TWO PRIOR SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENSES AND THEN COMMIT A THIRD.

SECTION 3. THIS BILL SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA'S GOVERNMENT.

SECTION 4. THIS BILL SHOULD BE IMPLEMENTED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF BILL PASSAGE.

A Bill to Establish a Maximum Pay for Businesses

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Wages shall be adjusted to according the highest and lowest paid members

SECTION 2. A. The maximum wage offered by businesses shall not exceed 20 times the pay of their lowest-earning employees

B. "Wages" shall be measured at dollars per hour

SECTION 3. The Department of Labor shall be responsible for the enforcement of this legislation

SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect immediately after passage

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Adopt Plastic Banknotes

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The U.S will cease the creation of paper currency and adopt
2 the use of plastic banknotes.

3 **SECTION 2.** Paper currency will still be accepted as legal tender, but no
4 longer will be produced.

5 **SECTION 3.** This process will be overseen by the U.S department of the
6 treasurey.

7 **SECTION 4.** This bill come into effect one year after passage so as to give
8 appropriate time to design new banknotes.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
 null and void.

A Bill to Abolish Guns from Hospitals

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** No hospital security personnel may bear fire-arms.
- 2 **SECTION 2.** A firearm is a weapon from which a projectile is fired by gunpowder.
- 3 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Homeland Security will oversee the enforcement of this
4 bill.
- 5 A. Security personnel may carry non-firearm weapons such as TASERS,
6 pepperspray, batons and stun guns.
- 7 B. \$500 million will be disbursed to hospitals across the country
8 depending on how many fire-armed security personnel they employ to
9 cover the re-training costs. These funds will be taken from the
10 Department of Defense budget.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into full effect on January 1st, 2017.
- 12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Cancer Research Funding to Improve Public Health

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** An additional \$5 billion will be provided in grants to government supported
2 cancer research labs. These funds will be taken from the Department of
3 Defense budget.

4 **SECTION 2.** A government supported cancer lab is any non-profit cancer research
5 project that is already being supported with government grants.

6 **SECTION 3.** This bill will be implemented and enforced by the Center for Disease
7 Control and the US Department of Treasury.

8 A. The grant money must be used solely for the different elements of
9 cancer research.

10 B. Labs interested in winning grants must go through an application
11 process where they detail a plan for effectively using funds.

12 C. A board of review will be created, consisting of 12 people who will
13 thoroughly evaluate each application. The CDC will appoint the
14 reviewers and set aside a small portion of the funds for forming the
15 board

16 D. The grant amount is up the board's discretion, but will be granted
17 based on the percentage of cancer patients in the US who have that
18 specific cancer with consideration of other elements such as the size of
19 the project and whether it is a successful endeavor.

20 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into full effect on January 1st, 2018.

21 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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A Bill to Mandate Student Vaccination

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- SECTION 1.** All public schools shall mandate regular vaccinations as a requirement for graduation
- SECTION 2.** A. School vaccinations shall be free to students that don't have access to a doctor
B. "Regular vaccinations" shall comply with CDC's Recommended Immunization Schedule for Minors.
- SECTION 3.** The Department of Education and the Center for Disease control shall be responsible for the enforcement of this legislation
A. Department of Education shall oversee the change in curriculum
B. CDC shall provide funding and supplies
- SECTION 4.** This bill will take effect for all public schools for 2019-2020 school year
- SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO ESTABLISH FELONY ENFRANCHISEMENT REQUIREMENTS NATIONWIDE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

SECTION I: The United States Federal Government will allow felons released from prison to vote at their respective polling places.

SECTION II: A. A felon is defined as a citizen that has committed a severe crime that requires greater than a year in prison.

B. All felons not serving a prison sentence at the time of an election will be given the right to vote as would any other American Citizen.

C. Severe crimes can include murder, burglary, kidnapping, et cetera, but said criminal shall be convicted as a felon at a judge's discretion.

D. All elections, whether be nationwide, statewide, countywide, or citywide are subject to this bill.

SECTION III: This bill will be implemented before October 31st, 2018, in time for the 2018 Midterm Election.

SECTION IV: All laws in conflict with this legislation will hereby be declared null and void.
