All News Agencies published or broadcasted shall henceforth be verified as credible or unreliable with a specific stamp designated by the Society of 4 5 Professional Journalists (SPJ). 6 A News Agency shall be defined as any organization that collects news 7 items and distributes them to newspapers or broadcasters. 8 A four level scale shall be utilized to categorize the News Agencies. В. 9 Level 1 - The highest level shall be granted to News Agencies 1. 10 deemed "Most Credible." 11 2. Level 2 - The second highest level shall be granted to News Agencies deemed "Credible." 12 Level 3 - The third highest level shall be granted to News Agencies 13 3. deemed "Somewhat Unreliable." 14 4. Level 4 - The lowest level shall be granted to News Agencies which 15 are deemed "Unreliable." 16 C. Additionally, print or broadcast media using materials from news agencies 17 18 assigned a particular stamp must identify any material from these sources with a reproduction of the assigned stamp on the material used. 19 20 **SECTION 2**. The SPJ will implement, oversee, and enforce this bill nationwide. 21 **SECTION 3**. Punishments for noncompliance will be a fine of \$1 million and possible termination of the News Agency... 22 23 **SECTION 4**. This bill will go into effect on May 1, 2020. PM #4 - A Bill to Stabilize Southeast Asia by Increasing US Military Support for the Region 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHWEST INDIANA NSDA STUDENT CONGRESS HERE 2 **ASSEMBLED THAT**: 3 **SECTION 1**. The United States will provide military support to promote stability in Southeast Asia, the South China Sea, and the Sea of Japan. 4 5 **SECTION 2**. Military aid will include both troops and technological assistance. The United States will increase its overall military presence in the region 6 7 by 20,000 troops. Initially, U.S. troops will be evenly divided between 8 bases in Japan and South Korea. Adjustments can be made as needed in 9 the future. 10 B. Technological assistance will include enhancement of the South Korean Navy by installing Aegis Ballistic Missile Defense Systems. Allocation of funding shall come from the current U.S. Defense budget. The Department of Defense will be responsible for this assistance with oversight provided through both the Executive and Legislative branches.

PM #5 - A Bill to Decrease the Cost of Attendance for State Colleges and Universities 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHWEST INDIANA NSDA STUDENT CONGRESS HERE 2 **ASSEMBLED THAT**: 3 **SECTION 1**. If a student's legal guardians' income is less than \$50,000 per year, that student will be able to attend their state university or college with free tuition. 4 5 **SECTION 2**. Tuition is not the total cost of attendance. The student would have to pay room and board and other fees. This free tuition would only be applied for the four 6 7 years of getting a bachelor's degree. The money colleges receive from tuition will 8 now be replaced by the federal and state government. The federal government 9 will give \$47 billion a year and the state government will give \$23 billion a year. 10 **SECTION 3**. The Department of Education will oversee this legislation. 11 **SECTION 4**. This legislation will go into effect before all sessions of state colleges and universities 2018-2019 school year begins. 12 13 **SECTION 5**. All other laws that are in conflict with this legislation shall hereby be declared null

PM #6 - A Constitutional Amendment to Reform the Election Process

		PW #6 - A Constitutional Amendment to Reform the Election Process
1	RESOLVED,	By two-thirds of the Northwest Indiana NSDA Student Congress here assembled,
2		that the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the
3		United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the
4		Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states
5		within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
6		ARTICLE
7	SECTION 1.	The President-Elect will be determined using a "best two out of three" process.
8	SECTION 2.	The three procedures used in the process shall be:
9		A. A Vote of the Senate: An anonymous vote by members of the U.S. Senate
10		will be held within 24 hours of the polls opening for the popular vote.
11		Ballots will not be counted until the last of the polls close on election day.
12		B. The Popular Vote: The candidate earning the most votes in the popular
13		election will be the second factor for consideration.
14		C. The Electoral College: The traditional Electoral College procedure will be
15		held between November 15th and 20th and will be the final factor for
16		consideration.
17	SECTION 3.	In the event of a three-way tie, the Senate will hold a re-vote between the
18		winners of the Electoral College and popular vote within seven days following the
19		election.
20	SECTION 4.	The Federal Election Commission will oversee the voting procedure.
21	SECTION 5.	This legislation will be enacted on January 1, 2020.
22	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
