A Resolution to Denounce the Sale of Weapons to Saudi Arabia to Promote Peace in the Middle East

- SECTION 1. The State Department announced the potential sale of Military arms to Saudi Arabia; and the sale of arms may harm innocent civilians and may fuel a regional arms race; and
- SECTION 2. The sale of arms may also contribute to the killing of innocent Yemen citizens, as has occurred in the past and may be further perpetuated by an influx of weapons into the region.
- SECTION 3. be it resolved by this Student Congress here assembled that: this legislative body vehemently disagrees with the proposed sale of weapons to the Saudi Arabian military by the United States State Department.

A Bill to Prohibit Sanctuary Campuses

- **SECTION 1.** Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 is amended to add the following:
 - A. No institution of higher education may institute a policy which knowingly provides education to persons not legally in the United States, or
 - B. Refuses to provide information to the Department of Homeland Security regarding their knowledge of the lawful status of attending students.
- **SECTION 2.** Institutions of higher education will include any 2 year or 4 year college or university which receives federal funding for any program under Title IV.
- SECTION 3. If the Secretary of Homeland Security determines that a campus is in violation of Section A, they will notify the Secretary of Education, who shall notify the institution of said violation and potential loss of federal funding.
- **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on September 1, 2018.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Improve Trade and Relations with India

- **SECTION 1.** The United States shall make overtures to establish a free trade agreement with India along with an upgrade in diplomatic relations.
- **SECTION 2.** "Trade" will not be limited only to commerce or aid. "Diplomatic relations" will include bilateral cooperation and intelligence sharing.
- **SECTION 3.** This Legislation will go into effect Fiscal Year 2019
- **SECTION 4.** The Department of Defense and Commerce will assume responsibility for supervision of their respective parts of this legislation.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Open up America's Resources

- **SECTION 1.** All current land controlled by the federal government shall be opened for private agricultural development.
- **SECTION 2.** Such development may include farming as well as livestock care taking.
- **SECTION 3.** The Department of the Interior will oversee development on federal land.
 - A. Rental fees for such development will be at the prevailing rate as determined by the DoI.
 - B. The Dol shall be permitted to cancel such development if it is determined that said development is no longer in the best public interest.
- **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on June 1, 2018.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
