A BILL TO REBUILD AND REVITALIZE PUERTO RICO

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** 100 Billion dollars shall be allocated for the rebuilding and revitalization of Puerto
- 3. Rico's infrastructure, public services, and healthcare; and for general aid to the population of the
- 4. territory.
- 5. **SECTION 2.** Infrastructure shall be defined as: transportation services, public utilities, and
- 6. communications systems. Public Services shall be defined as any service that protects general welfare
- 7. of the population of the island such as but not limited to: law enforcement and fire protection.
- 8. **SECTION 3.** The United States Army Corps of Engineers shall oversee this legislation and order help
- 9. from other government agencies for the re-establishment of services.
- 10. **SECTION 4**. This Bill Shall take effect immediately after passage.
- 11. **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO PLACE AN EMBARGO ON MYANMAR

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** In response to the genocide of the Rohingya people by the Myanmar government,
- 3. the United States will place a full embargo on Myanmar.
- 4. **SECTION 2**. Embargo will be defined as an official ban on trade or other commercial activity
- 5. with Myanmar.
- 6. **SECTION 3.** The Department of State in conjunction with the Department of Commerce will
- 7. oversee the implementation of this bill.
- 8. **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect 30 day after passage.
- 9. **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO RESTORE NET NEUTRALITY

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1**. Net Neutrality regulations shall be restored under the Telecommunications Act.
- 3. **SECTION 2.** "Net Neutrality" is defined as: the requirement that internet service providers must
- 4. treat all internet data the same regardless of content, source, or destination. Internet service
- 5. providers may not establish payment or service plans that restrict, slow, or accelerate the flow of
- 6. data for any reason including the amount paid by the consumer.
- 7. **SECTION 3.** The FCC will oversee the implementation and the enforcement of this law.
- 8. Any company found to be in violation of Net Neutrality may be fined up to \$2.5 million per
- 9. violation.
- 10. **SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented within 90 days after the passage
- 11. **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
