## A Bill to Combat the Opioid Crisis

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	\$10 billion shall be allocated to the opening of supervised safe		
3		injection centers that will provide needle exchanges and fentanyl tests		
4		in cities across the United States.		
5	SECTION 2.	Definitions:		
6		<b>A.</b> A safe injection center is defined as a clean and safe environment		
7		where opioid users can administer the drugs with medical		
8		supervision in the case of overdose.		
9		<b>B.</b> A needle exchange is defined as a place to drop off used needles in		
10		the exchange for new, sterile, needles.		
11		<b>C.</b> Fentanyl tests are defined as an optional test for users who want		
12		to know whether their dosage contains fentanyl.		
13	SECTION 3.	The Office of National Drug Control Policy will oversee the		
14		implementation of this legislation.		
15	SECTION 4.	The bill will be implemented on August 1, 2018.		
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and		
17		void.

#### A Bill to Rebuild Afghanistan's Economy for the Repatriation of Afghan Refugees

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	The United States Agency for International Development shall	
3		collaborate with the United Nations Development Program, the United	
4		Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, and the Afghan Government	
5	to institute youth and vocational employment programs,		
6	infrastructure development, and settlement ownership.		
7	SECTION 2.	The infrastructure-driven development shall be focused on	
8 transportation, sewage, schools, hospitals, and wa		transportation, sewage, schools, hospitals, and water and electric	
9	systems. Promoting settlement ownership shall involve clarifying		
10		property rights, formalizing settlements, and increasing accessibility	
11		to affordable housing.	
12	SECTION 3.	The United States Federal Government shall allocate \$150 billion of	
13		the U.S. Military and Defense budget towards the USAID in order to	
14		implement this legislation.	
15	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall go into effect on January 1, 2019.	
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and	
17		void.

## A Bill to Reduce Military Spending

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:	
2	<b>SECTION 1</b> . The United States Federal Government reduce military spending by		
3		50% to be able to further fund other beneficial programs (Ex:	
4		healthcare and education).	
5	SECTION 2. Military spending is defined as the funds allocated to pay any mi		
6		related expenditures.	
7	SECTION 3.	This will be overseen by the U.S. Department of Defense.	
8	SECTION 4.	This bill will gradually take effect at the start of the next fiscal year,	
9		and will be fully in effect by the end of fiscal year 2021.	
10	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and	
11		void.

## A Bill to Require Childhood Immunizations

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	Children in the United States shall receive all childhood		
3		immunizations at the appropriate ages. However, children with		
4		cancer or children taking drugs that lower the body's immunities shall		
5		be exempt until their immunities are back to normal.		
6	SECTION 2.	Children shall be defined as "people between birth and full growth; a		
7		boy or a girl between the ages of 1 month to the day before their $18^{\text{th}}$		
8		birthday". Childhood immunizations shall be defined as, "vaccines that		
9		protect children from more than a dozen childhood diseases".		
10	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Health and Human Services shall		
11		oversee the implementation of this bill.		
12		A. All parents/guardians who do not vaccinate their children will be		
13		charged with felony child endangerment and shall be imprisoned		
14		for duration of 1-10 years.		
15		B. Vaccines will be subsidized for those who are unable to afford it		
16		and are in the lowest tax bracket.		
17	SECTION 4.	This bill shall go into effect immediately upon passage.		
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and		
19		void.

#### A Bill to Stop the Illicit Use of Cryptocurrencies

1	BE IT ENACT	ACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	All cryptocurrency trading platforms will be required to follow know-		
3		your-customer protocols ("KYC protocols") for transactions of greater		
4		value than \$150.		
5	SECTION 2.	Definitions.		
6		A. Cryptocurrencies (for example, Bitcoin, Ethereum, and Zcash) are		
7		defined as digital currencies in which encryption techniques are		
8		used to regulate the generation of units of currency and verify the		
9		transfer of funds, operating independently of a central bank or		
10		government backing.		
11		B. Cryptocurrency trading platforms are defined as businesses which		
12		exchange cryptocurrencies for other cryptocurrencies or for fiat		
13		currencies, such as the US dollar.		
14		C. KYC protocols are defined as procedures by which cryptocurrency		
15		trading platforms collect identification data from users in the form		
16		of valid government-issued ID, name-check users against a		
17		database of known offenders, determine a user's risk profile for		
18		commission of crimes related to cryptocurrencies, and store this		
19		information indefinitely.		
20	SECTION 3.	The Securities and Exchange Commission will enforce this legislation.		
21	SECTION 4.	This legislation will go into effect 1 January 2019.		
22	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and		
23		void.

# A Bill to Extend the Temporary Protected Status of El Salvador

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	Those granted temporary protected status are not removable from		
3		the United States, can obtain an employment authorization document		
4		(EAD), and may be granted travel authorization. The TPS termination		
5		date will be extended until May 9, 2021. The EAD termination date		
6		will be extended until the termination date of the TPS.		
7	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Homeland Security will oversee enforcement		
8		of this bill.		
9	SECTION 4.	This bill will be implemented on September 9, 2019.		
10	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and		
11		void.

#### A Resolution to Ban Artificial Intelligence for the Military

1	WHEREAS,	the world is on the brink of an artificial intelligence (AI) arms race
2		within the next decades; and
3	WHEREAS,	AI will be a critical part of any nation's ongoing defense strategy; and
4	WHEREAS,	the use of autonomous weapons has the potential to exacerbate
5		human injuries and deaths on the battlefield;
6	WHEREAS,	lethal autonomous weapon systems could result in mass casualties,
7		initiate conflicts and escalate future wars; now, therefore, be it
8	RESOLVED,	that the Department of Defense should ban the research, funding, and
9		use of lethal autonomous technology for military purposes.

1	WHEREAS,	Iraqi Kurds have consistently called for an independent Kurdistan;
2		and
3	WHEREAS,	The Kurds have been brutally oppressed by successive Iraqi
4		governments; and
5	WHEREAS,	The Kurds are politically, ethnically and culturally distinct from the
6		rest of Iraq; and
7	WHEREAS,	The United States has considerable global influence; now, therefore,
8		be it
9	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled recognize an independent and
10		sovereign Iraqi Kurdistan.
